Request IR-1:

Please describe how electricity is used in your home over time so the Board can better understand your usage. In your response, please include:

- a) A brief description of your home (approximate size, how much of it is heated, and how many people live there).
- b) The main things in your home that use electricity (for example: electric heat, hot water tank, hot tub, large appliances, etc.), and how often they are typically used.
- c) Any important changes over time that would affect your electricity use, such as:
 - Installing or stopping use of a hot tub
 - Changes in heating (for example, under-heating due to cost)
 - Changes in how many people live in the home
 - Any equipment added or removed.
- d) For the hot tub specifically, when was it used and when did usage stop and was still powered even when not in use.
- e) Have you taken any steps to reduce or investigate your electricity use (for example, changing heating habits, getting an energy audit, or having an electrician review your system).
