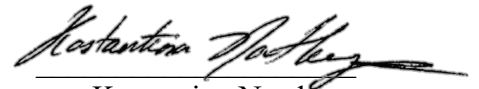
ECEL intends to appear at the oral hearing of this matter. The issues it may address include any or all of the issues established by the Board.
