M12786 – Nova Scotia Power Incorporated – 2025 Storm Restoration Cost Report

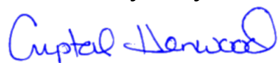
The Board acknowledges receipt of the 2025 Storm Restoration Cost Report. The panel assigned to this matter is Richard J. Melanson, LL.B., Panel Chair; Steven M. Murphy, MBA., P.Eng., Member and Jennifer L. Nicholson, CPA, CA, Member.

The Storm Report arises from a settlement agreement and Board decision in NS Power's 2022 General Rate Application (see: 2023 NSUARB 12). It is part of the requirements related to a Storm Cost Recovery Rider the Board approved for a three-year trial period that started in 2023. In the Board's recent decision in NS Power's 2025 General Rate Application (see: 2026 NSEB 8) the Board approved the extension of the pilot program for 2026 and 2027, with a change to make the rider symmetrical (i.e. require the return of funds to customers in addition to the ability to charge customers). This change will be effective in 2026.

The Board notes there will be no Storm Cost Recovery Rider application for 2025 because NS Power did not incur operating costs for Level 3 and 4 storms beyond those already included in rates. The Board is providing interested parties with an opportunity to review and comment on the Storm Report. The following timetable has been established for this matter:
