Thank you for your email of August 7, 2026. In response to your questions regarding a withdrawal, I can confirm that if you choose to withdraw your complaint, all related documents and materials will be removed from the Board's database and website. As a result, no filed documents will remain accessible to the public.

Because you filed all of your documents electronically, no paper documents exist. Therefore, no paper documents will be retained by the Board.

If you do not withdraw your complaint, any member of the general public may attend at the Board's offices and request to view the file which includes your personal identifiers. However, as noted by our offices previously, no member of the public has ever requested to see the unredacted documentation (other than the parties which already have them) in over 10 years. In addition, if someone were to request to view the file, the Clerk's office would assess whether it may be for an improper purpose, and the Board has the authority to deny the request.

In light of the above, please advise whether you wish to proceed or withdraw your complaint.
